Journal responses are one of the few writing assignments that provide complete control over subject, structure and style. Taking a more personal, less formal approach to writing about literature, these brief papers offer the chance to respond to required reading in a way that fits your interests and learning style.

How to Write a Journal Response | Pen and the Pad

To write a journal response to a book, start by writing a summary of the book to explain the author's main points, and provide 1 to 2 quotes from the text to support your analysis. Then, give your commentary on the book, explaining why you agree or disagree with what the author says.

Reader Response Journal Prompts For each Journal entry, please make sure to write the day's date in the upper, right hand corner of the page. On the top line of the page, please write the title of the book as well as the most recent page read. On the first line down, please COPY (word-for-word) the journal prompt to which you are responding.

For example, in the "Seasons" grass is green, the sky is blue, sand is brown, apples are red, pumpkins are orange, and snow is white; the author easily could have painted these objects in hues of imagination, however the writer chose to demonstrate these objects in their naturally expected forms, encouraging standard ideals of the world (14,16,18, 19).

Reader responses also help you connect the new things you are learning with what you already know from your own life and other things you've read. Many jobs require employees to respond and write up their experiences and thoughts about what they read. For example: Nurses need to write up a patient report about they observations.

Reflective journals are most often used to record detailed descriptions of certain aspects of an

event or thought. For example, who was there, what was the purpose of the event, what do you think about it, how does it make you feel, etc. Write down everything, even if you don't have a clear idea of how this information will be helpful.
